It all started in Warrensburg, NY in 1996. That's about 70 gatherings of music, dance, good food, conversation and we are not done yet!

This year we feature the joyous musical life of **Richard Geisler**, a talented and enthusiastic musician, publisher, founder of numerous ensembles - a man who filled the lives of many with music. He died in 2012 and his wife Karen gave us his manuscripts so that his music would continue to live. Over the

decades he worked on arranging various styles of music for recorder: World Folk, Christmas, Early Music, Americana, Romantic, Madrigals, Recorder Orchestra. Over the three days we'll feature as many styles as is possible.

With a sessions on various series such as:

- 1. **Spirit of Spain** (Renaissance composers of Spain -Francisco Guererro & his contemporaries,
- 2. **Americana Editions** –arrangements of songs like *Over the Rainbow*, *The Baby Elephant Walk* (Manccini), *Downtown* (made famous by Petula Clark) even *Here Comes the Sun* by George Harrison also many early 20th century tunes.
- 3. **Grandios Editions** for recorder orchestra, a wide variety of music such as: Aaron Copland's *An Outdoor Overture*,
 Dimitri Shostakovich's *Polka* from "The Golden Age",
 the Largo from the New World Symphony by Anton Dvorak, *Fancy Free* from "Three Dance Variations" by Leonard Bernstein,
 Suite I, 1917 Ancient Dances & Arias by Respighi, and
- Concerto Comique by Baroque composer Michel Corrette (1709-1795)
 4. The Swinging Shepherd Blues by Moe Koffman, 1957 one of Richard's last arrangements completed in 2011

So come, play music, expand your horizons! Bring all your instruments sopranino to contras we'll Need them all for this retrospective. There is a lifetime of music to explore together.

Of course the faculty concert is Saturday evening Richie & Elaine will entertain You with a most unusual duet version of Vivaldi's *Four Seasons*.

To lower your costs for this workshop we've shortened it to two full days instead of three. This means a reduced hotel bill and our lower fee *includes* the evening dessert on Sat, <u>and</u> a group lunch on Sunday.

The Faculty Concert will be Saturday night – guests welcome.

P.S. The playing level required for participants is a solid intermediate. You must be: comfortable with the book *Dexterity Exercises and Dances for Recorder* by G. Rooda, rhythmically independent, comfortable with syncopations, various articulations (including slurs), and reading accidentals. All instruments from sopranino to contra bass will be needed. Soprano players must play tenor, alto players must play alto up 8va and bass or tenor.
